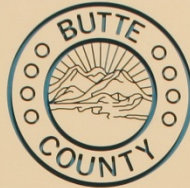

# PREPARATION

- Meeting with Regulating Agencies
- Determination of Required Permits
- Development of a Comprehensive Operation Plan
- Providing Copies of the Operation Plan to Certain Agencies (CUPA, Fire Department)

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# IMPLEMENTATION

- HHW Manager should review the Operations Plan at least annually
- Use the DTSC HHW Facility Inspection Sheet to verify compliance
- If modification of the Operations Plan is needed, discuss the modification with the CUPA and Fire Department before making the change

## **Do's:**

- ✓ Invite the CUPA and Fire Department for periodic site visits
- ✓ Be open to inspections and the assessment of the operation
- ✓ Be courteous

## Don't:

- Be dishonest
- Hide or divert issues
- Falsify documents or records

# CORRECTIVE ACTION

## **IF ANY DEFICIENCY IS DISCOVERED:**

- ✓ If the issue is simple, try to correct on the spot
- ✓ If more complex, establish a timeline agreeable to both parties in writing
- ✓ Maintain periodic communication with the agency, providing updates on returning to compliance
