



➤ Concerns about stockpiling of CRT glass were initially raised by industry officials and reported in the Transparent Planet study (2012). The CRT White Paper (September, 2013)

CRT White Paper Update 2014

- Ohio: "Overwhelming" numbers of CRTs were dumped in recycling trailers.
- Denver, Colorado: Luminous Recycling abandoned 8,000 tons of CRT glass in a Warehouse and additional 750 tons in rented trailers.

Baltimore, Maryland: CDM eCycling was reported to have abandoned 3,000 gaylords of CRTs.

Pennsylvania and New York: eco International (formerly an R2 certified recycler) abandoned 12,000 tons of CRT glass.

Ohio: 2TRG (formerly an R2 and e-Stewards certified recycler) abandoned 1,500 to 3,000 tons of CRT glass.

North Carolina: Franklin's Recycling 75 tons he can't afford to process

- eCycleSecure (formerly an R2 and eStewards certified) 400 tons of CRT glass.
- Upon notification of the need to send the glass to a processor, 75% of the glass was sent to Closed Loop Refining & Recycling who admitted: they had over 45,000 tons of unprocessed glass at just one of their two facilities.

- Yuma, Arizona: Dow Management abandoned 4,500 tons of CRT glass.
- Samples taken on the property found levels of lead 75 times the maximum federal and state exceedance level.
- These reports only address reported incidents of abandonment.



620,000 premature deaths occur in India from air pollution-related diseases. This is up from 100,000 deaths in 2000 – a six-fold increase.


