






Purpose of the Farm & Ranch Grant Program



- Funding for cleanup of illegal disposal sites on farm and ranch property
- "Farm & Ranch Property"
- Active/fallow land
- Zoned for Ag

Eligible Applicants

Landowner can't apply directly

- Cities & Counties
- Federally Recognized Native American tribes
- Resource Conservation Districts



Site Eligibility

- Unauthorized dumping on a farm or ranch parcel
 - Includes garbage, tires, HHW
 - Does not include rusty farm equipment, falling down buildings, drug lab waste
- Property owner is not responsible
 - Not owner's waste or inherited from relative
 - Not from a renter, lessee, friend etc...

Site Eligibility continued...

- Cleanup necessary to protect public health and safety, or the environment
- Property is zoned, or otherwise authorized, for agricultural activities

Current use/intended future use must fit farm/ranch definition

Grants

- Competitive sort of
- Reimburse
- **\$50,000**/site
- \$200,000/applicant/year
- No matching funds required
- Applications due:July October February



Eligible Costs

- Disposal & recycling
- Personnel
- Administrative costs
- Re-vegetation
- Prevention measures
 Fencing, gates, signage
- Public education

Grant Application Process

Applicant finds a site (or sites)
 Complaint, request from owner, etc.



- Obtain contractor bid
- Online application
- Application reviewed
- Grant awarded/begin cleanup



Reimbursement Grants

- For sites previously remediated
- Same application form
- Must provide "before" photos, plus disposal/recycling receipts
- No statute of limitations...

- Two types of Grants
 - 2 year grant term
 - Waste Tire Cleanup Grants

Waste Tire Amnesty Grants



WASTE TIRE CLEANUP GRANTS

- Provides funds to cleanup illegally dumped tires
 - Roadside
 - Private property
 - Must not be landowners tires
 - Must sign Affidavit if over 500 tires
 - No Ag property except spill over from right-of-way



WASTE TIRE AMNESTY GRANTS

- Funds to hold free tire collection events for the public
 - Up to \$40K single jurisdiction
 - Date specific events, or at landfill
 - Convenient locations
 - Up to 9 tires, or 20 with exemption
 - No tires from dealers

Waste Tire Cleanup Grant

- Application available December 2015 (tentative)
- Applications due February 2016 (tentative)

Waste Tire Amnesty Grant

- Application due date just passed
- Next cycle 2017

Solid Waste Cleanup Program

- Remediates solid waste disposal and waste tire sites where the responsible party either cannot be identified or is unable or unwilling to pay for timely remediation.
- Environmental or public health and safety threat must be present
- ► Eligible applicants include:
 - Cities
 - Counties
 - Districts (Water, Irrigation, etc)
 - State Agencies
 - Tribes (CalRecycle managed cleanups only)



Types of Funding Available

- ► Legacy Disposal Site Abatement Partial Grants matching grants to assist local governments with remediation of old legacy dumps (burn dumps)
- ► Illegal Disposal Site Abatement Grants for the cleanup of illegal disposal sites
- ➤ CalRecycle-Managed Remediation use CalRecycle chosen environmental and engineering contractors for site investigation and remediation where a responsible party is unwilling or financially unable to perform timely remediation.
- ► Program generally receives \$5 million per year
- Of the \$5 million half goes to grants and half to CalRecycle managed cleanups

How is the Program Different From the Farm and Ranch Grant Program?

- ➤ Similar, but different. For the Solid Waste Cleanup Program:
 - Property zoning type is not a factor
 - ▶ Higher grant amounts
 - ▶ Different eligible applicants
 - Eligible expenditures vary
 - CalRecycle can seek recovery of cleanup funds from responsible party
