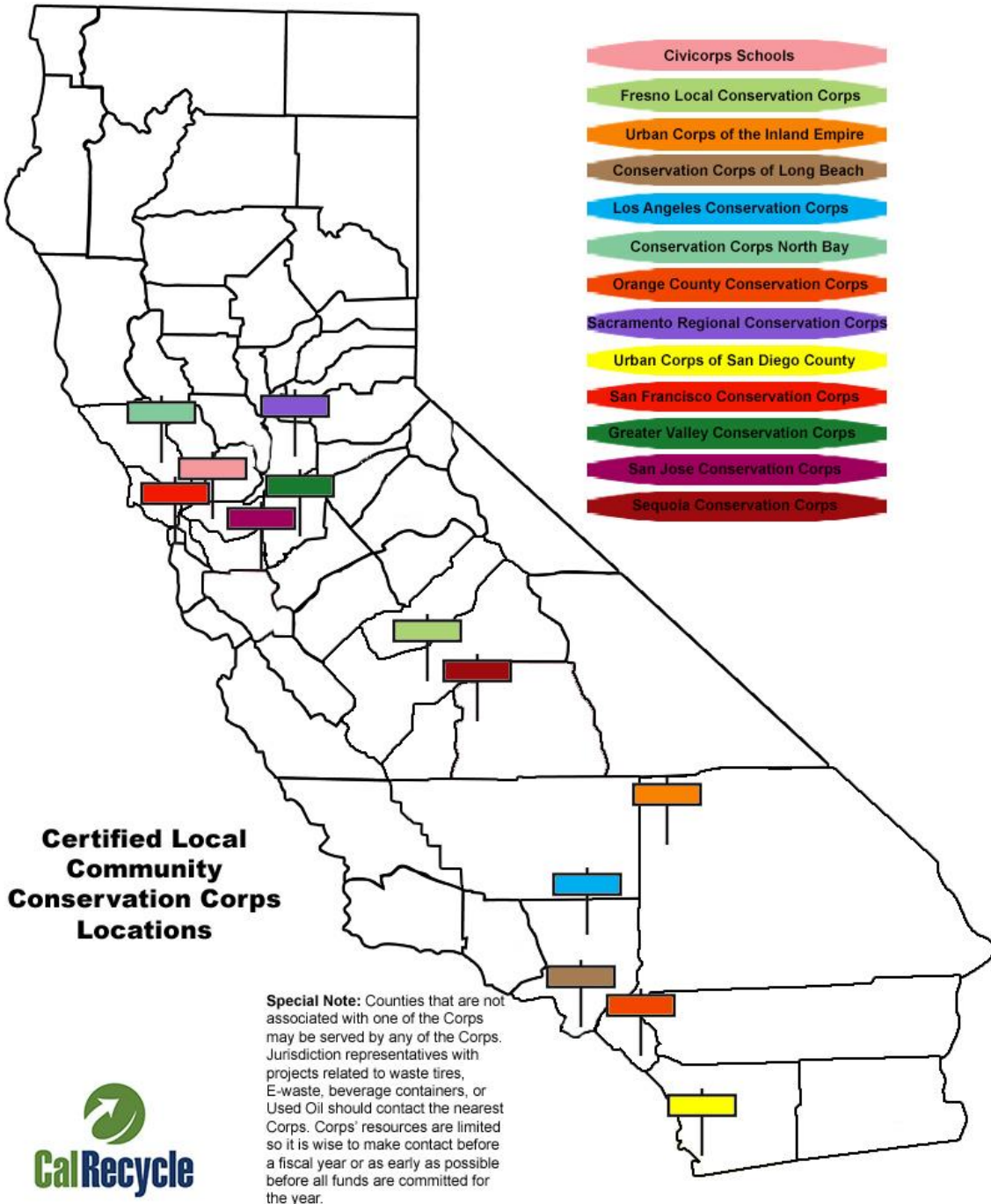
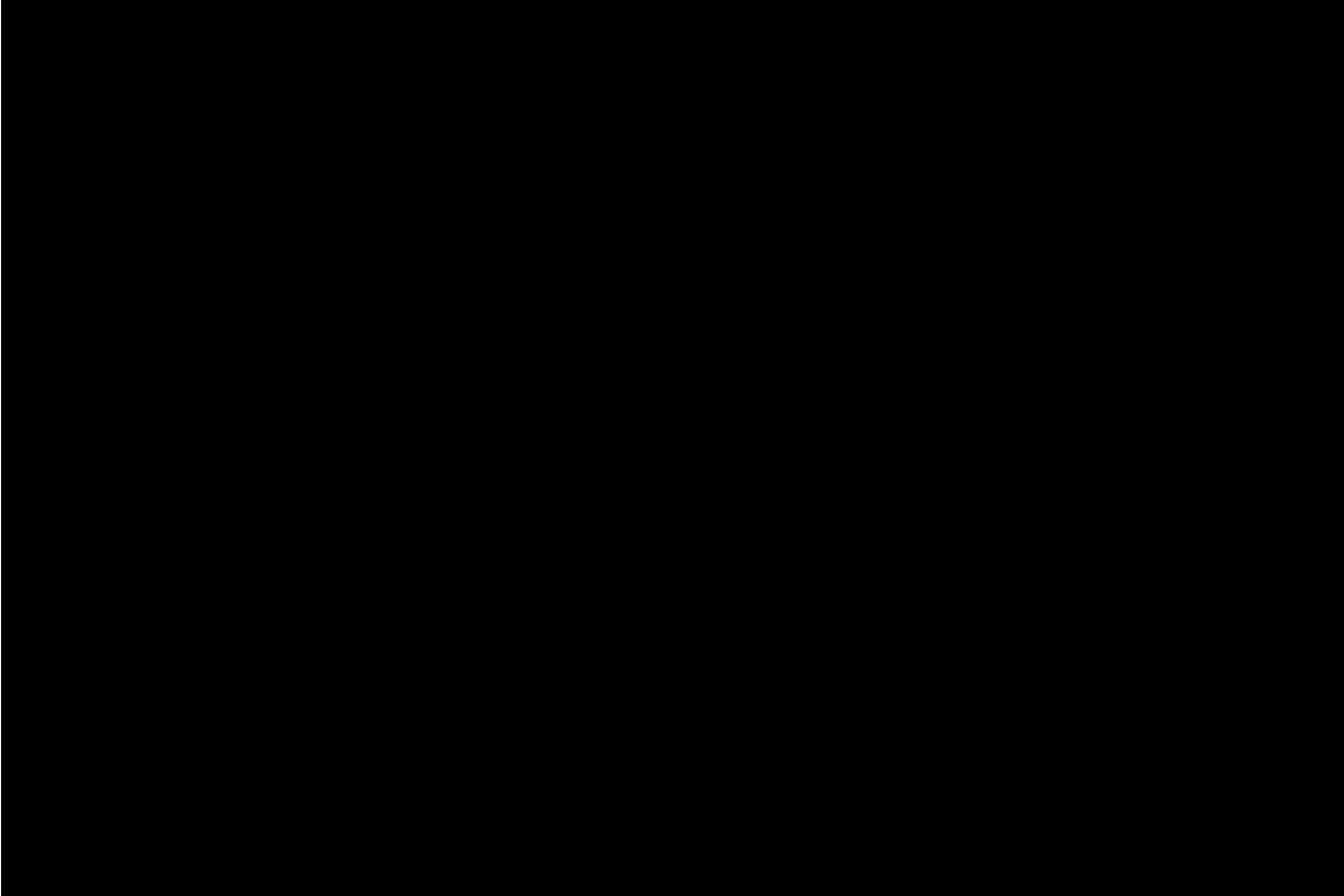


# Local Community Conservation Corps Grant Program



There are thirteen Local Conservation Corps across California from San Diego north to Sonoma County.





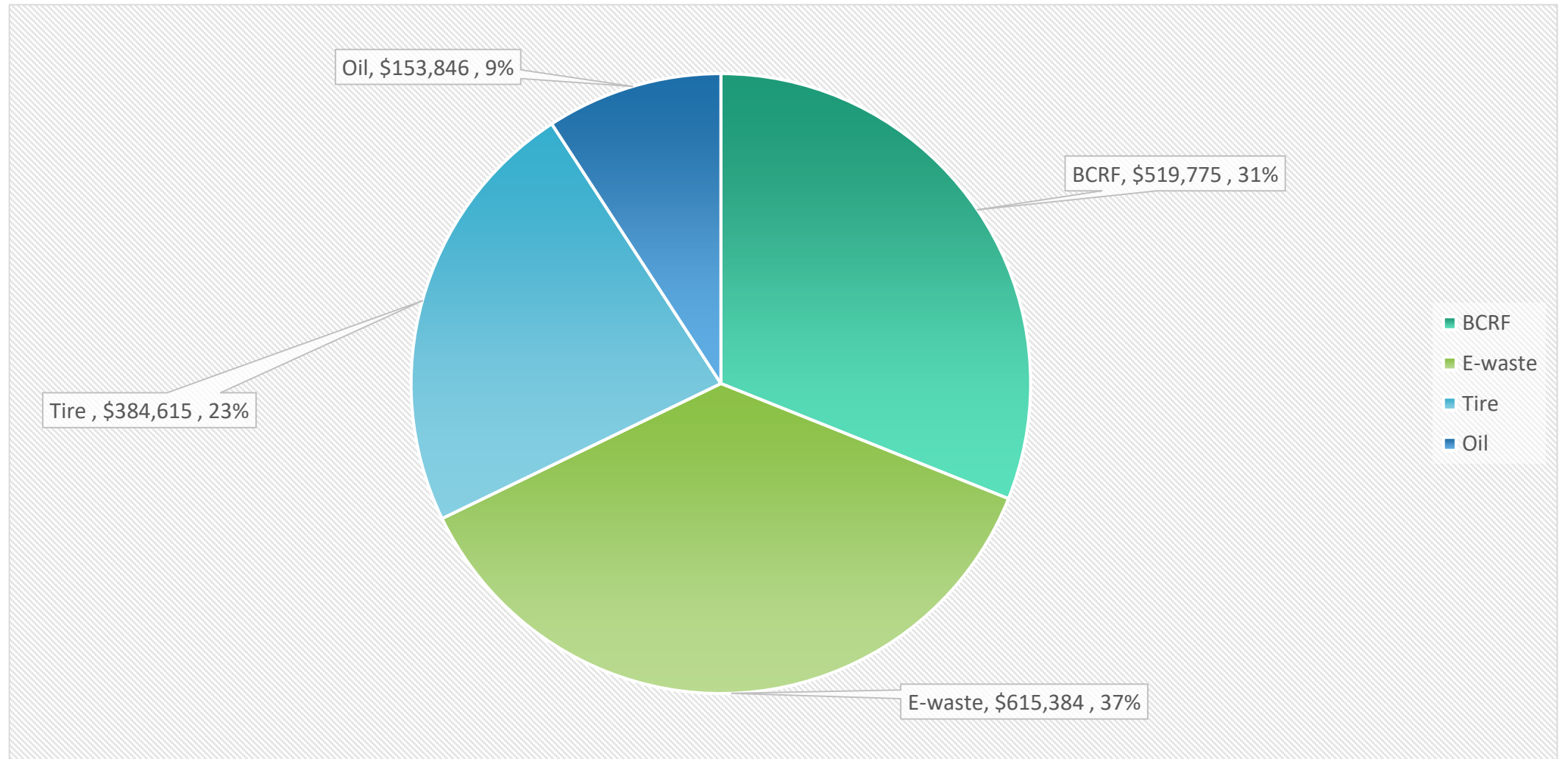

# Facts about the Corps

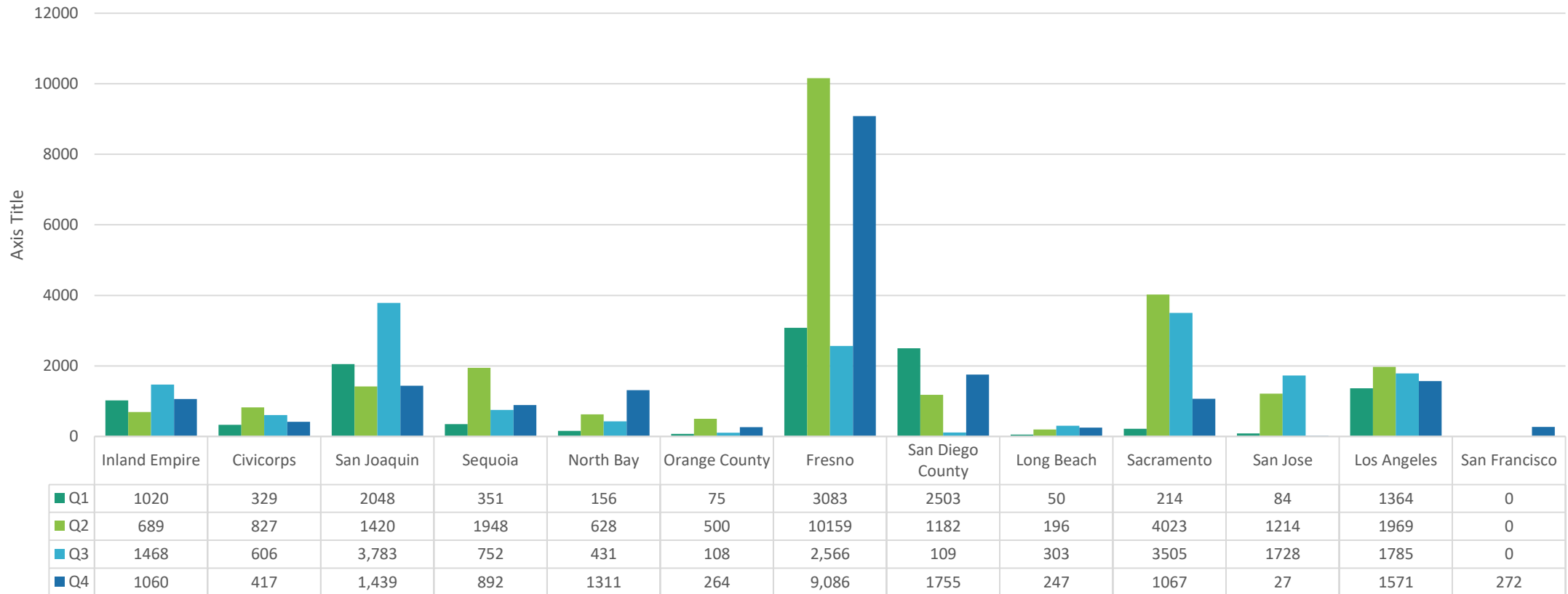
- CalRecycle's grant can be no more than 75% of the annual corporate budget.
- Each Corps is certified annually by the California Conservation Corps.
- Each Corps operates or collaborates with a Charter School.
- Each Corps must maintain an average monthly enrollment of 50 Corpsmembers.

# Cycle 31 Local Conservation Corps Grant Funding



The total tires collected in fiscal year 2014-15 was 15,294 and in 2015-16 the Corps collected 72,584 tires (+373%).

Waste Tire Collection FY15-16

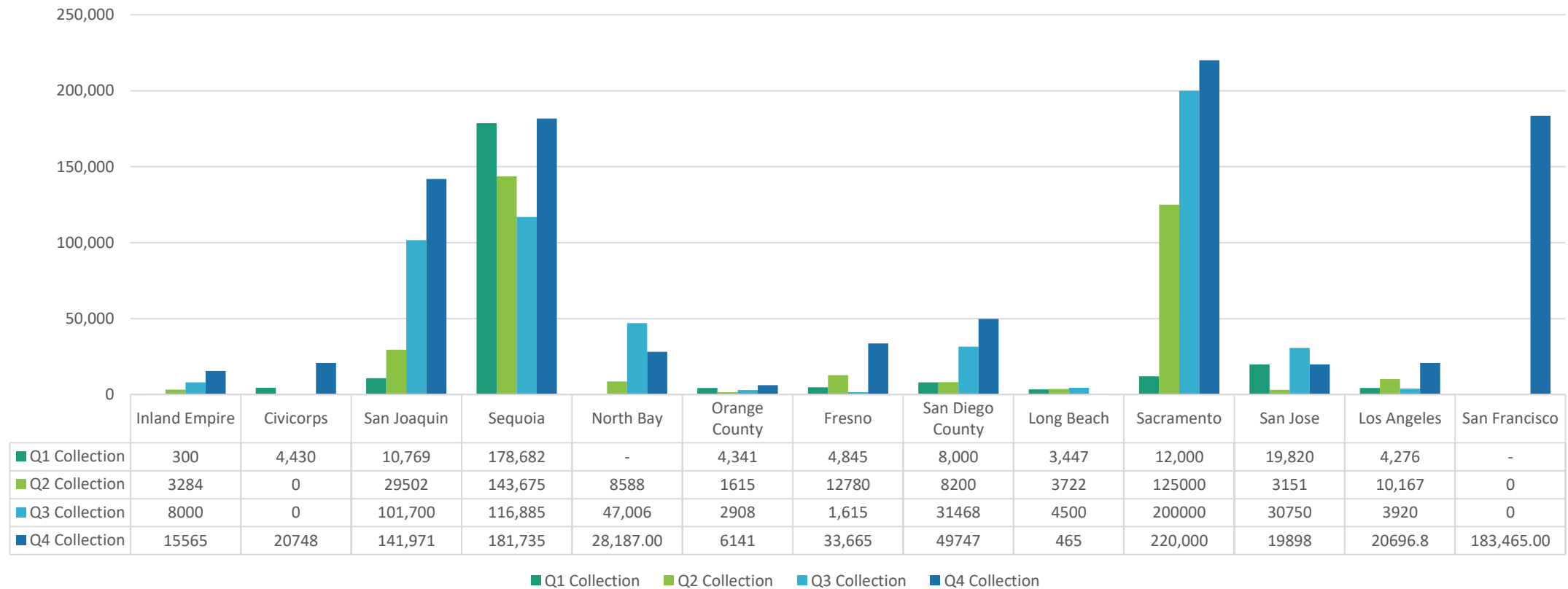






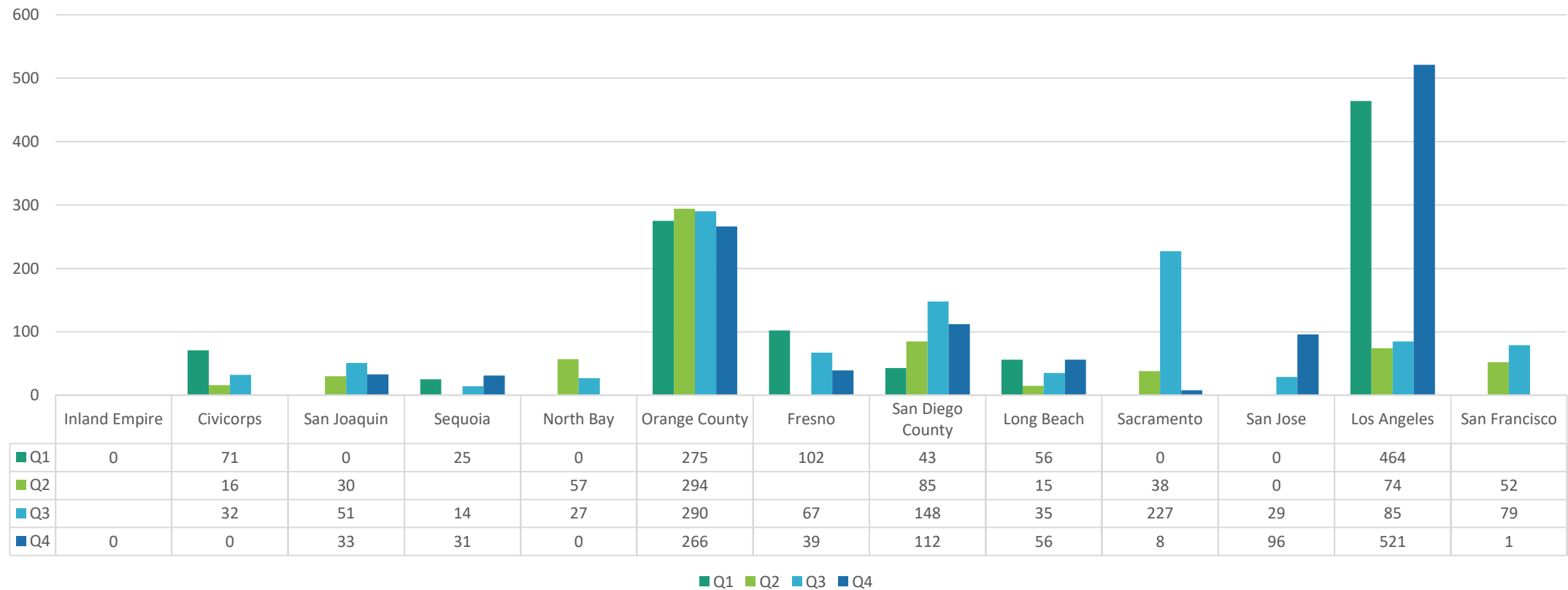
The Corps collected 2,071,630 pounds of E-waste in 2015-16 compared to 610,000 pounds in 2014-15, a 239% increase. A total of 707,220 pounds of CEW was collected and transferred by the Corps.

The Corps have completed signage reviews at 3,944 CCC sites in 2015-16 compared to 1,310 reviews during 2014-15, a 201% increase.
