

Commercial

- Existing System
 - Fees paid on volume of solid waste collected
 - Fluctuates with diversion, economy, etc.

- New System
 - Flat fee per agreement
 - Guaranteed revenue for IWM and GF
 - \$10M franchise fees, \$4.2M AB939 fees
