The Los Angeles County Recycling Market Development Zone (RMDZ) Program Can Help!

The RMDZ program combines recycling with economic development to fuel new businesses, expand existing ones, create jobs, and divert waste from landfills. The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery, through the RMDZ program, can assist qualifying companies.

HOW DO YOU QUALIFY?

Your business may qualify if it meets the following criteria:

Low interest, fixed-rate loan program. Currently, the program can find loans to a maximum of \$2 million.

Staff can help you find raw materials, recommend changes to reduce your disposal costs, and even develop new revenue streams.

<p>OBITUARIES</p> <p>Aram Arakelian 1947-2017</p>  <p>Aram Arakelian, born November 12, 1947, passed away on Monday November 27, 2017, at his home in Covina, California, after suffering a sudden heart attack. His passing was unexpected and the immense void he leaves behind is deeply felt by his loved ones.</p> <p>Born in Stuttgart, Germany, Aram's family immigrated to New York City when he was two years old. The family lived in Rosklyn, New York for two years and then moved to the Bronx, where he started his education at Grand Sage Public School, P.S. 55. Shortly after, his family moved to Richmond Hill, New York, where he continued his education at Robert W. Wyck Junior High School, P.S. 217.</p> <p>Aram attended Thomas Edison High School, where he graduated with honors and as valedictorian of his graduating class. He met the love of his life, Carol, during his sophomore year of high school and they have been inseparable ever since. His college years took him to Farmingdale State College, where he pursued an electrical engineering degree. After two years, he changed his major and went to the graduate at New York City College, with a degree in Construction Management.</p> <p>Aram began his career in New York City, as a facilities engineer for the New York Telephone Company. However, he soon began a career in general contracting, which spanned over 40 years. In 1972, he relocated his family to Los Angeles, and joined the Inland Empire Division of Turner Construction Company. In 1977, Aram joined Rogers International as an executive position and successfully helped the firm grow to one of the top 400 Contractors in the United States.</p> <p>Aram's love to build his own contracting firm was realized in 1984 with the establishment of Environmental Contracting. Another dream was realized in 2002, when Environmental designed and built its own building on the corner of First and Virginia, in Downtown Los Angeles. Over the years, Aram has been a continual driving force in raising the levels of interior construction in Los Angeles and Orange Counties. The pre-construction budgeting process he created to assist designers, brokers and clients has become an industry standard, among other industry awards. His award-winning projects have been featured in Interior Design Magazine, Contract Magazine, and have won numerous ICA Southern California College Design Awards.</p> <p>In 1982, driven from a passion to support the future of our industry, Aram established the Inland Scholarship Fund for the International Interior Design Association (IIDA) Southern California Chapter. This self-sustaining fund now helps interior design students throughout the Greater Los Angeles and Orange County area achieve a quality design education. As a result, he was honored with Lifetime Achievement Award by IIDA for his contribution to education in 1999. The Los Angeles Area Council Boy Scouts of America honored Aram with a Distinguished Good Scout Title in 1992, in recognition of his service, patriotism and example to the youth of our country. In 1994, Pepperdine University awarded Aram with a Distinguished Philanthropy.</p> <p>Aram loved traveling with his family. In particular, he enjoyed visiting New York City in the winter. In New York, he loved people watching while enjoying a Subrett hot dog, New York pizza or rice pudding. He loved discovering small "hidden in the west" shops and directing travel activities with his friends and family.</p> <p>Aram was a passionate man with two main loves – his work and his family. Everyone who knew Aram admired his intellect, work ethic, and most of all, his compassion and willingness to help friends and colleagues in any way he could.</p> <p>In 1977, Aram was elected a James Dean Memorial – It was one of his favorite projects. On the memorial itself, "Death is the one inevitable, unchangeable truth. Beyond it, through uncertainty, the only hope." While his passing was sudden, Aram would love his friends, family and colleagues to continue his life and legacy by continuing to pursue excellence, integrity, quality and philanthropy.</p> <p>Aram is survived by his wife Carol; his daughters, Angela, Tina and Jan; sons, Steven, Lawrence and Michael; his grandsons and granddaughter, Mike Acers and Sophie; his sisters Lucy and Susan, and Mike his brother-in-law.</p> <p>In lieu of flowers, donations are requested for the IIDA Southern California Chapter Scholarship Awards.
