Orange County RMDZ



The Orange County Recycling Market Development Zone (OC RMDZ) is an economic development program that utilizes the growing supply of recyclable materials to fuel new businesses, expand existing ones, create jobs, and divert waste from landfills. The program fosters and supports eligible businesses that supply or utilize secondary materials; creating a circular economy and enhancing the County's economic development potential.

Orange County Features

The total number of businesses within the County is 1,381,148, with projected economic growth expected to add 56,500 jobs by 2017. The County's economy has 13.2 percent centered on manufacturing and 14 percent centered on waste management services. It is projected that industrial production will grow at an average rate of 2.5 percent each year. The Cities of Huntington Beach, Stanton, Santa Ana, Garden Grove, and Orange all have industrial clusters accessible by six freeways (SR-22, SR-405, SR-55, SR-57, SR-91, and SR-5).

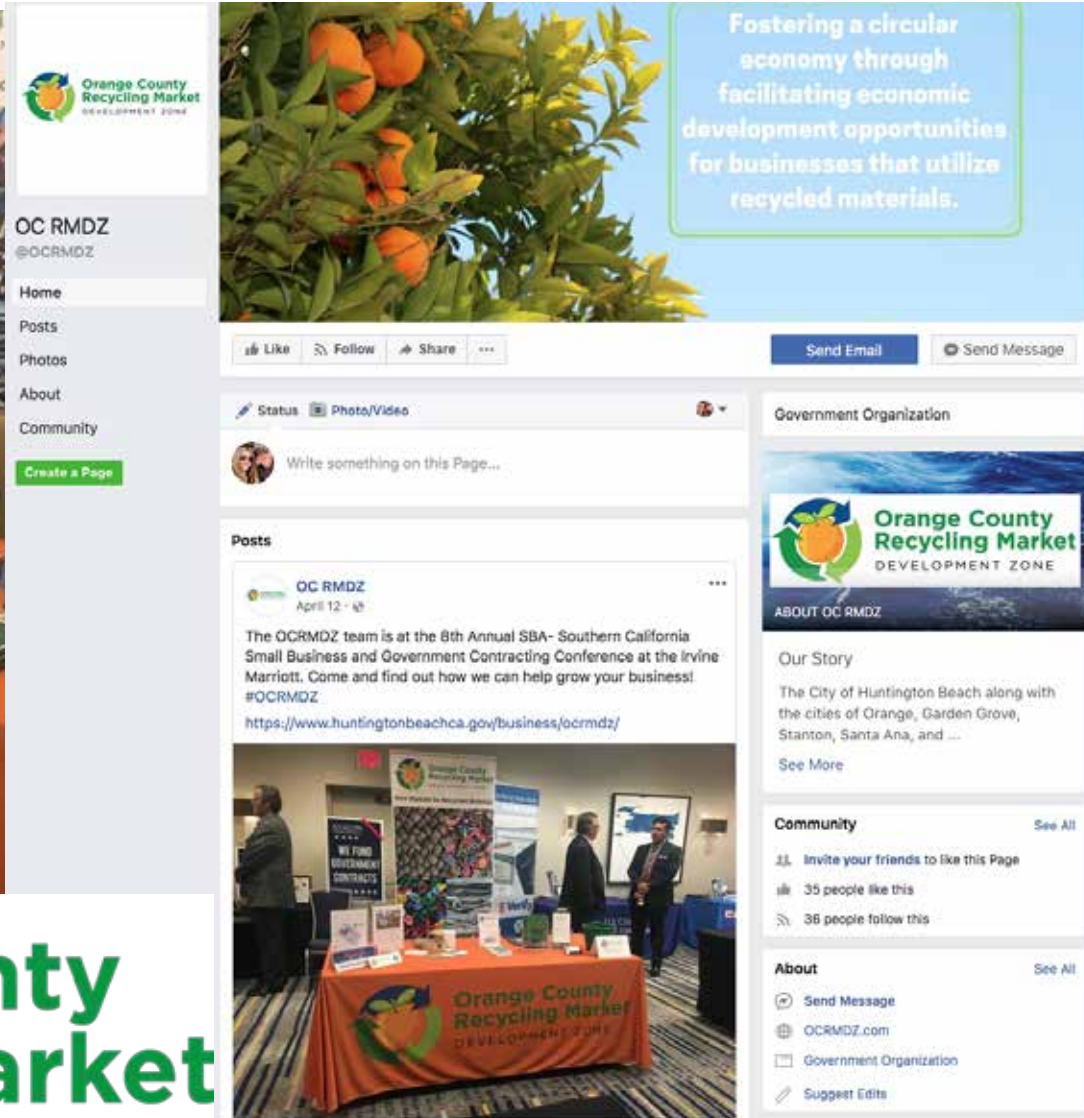

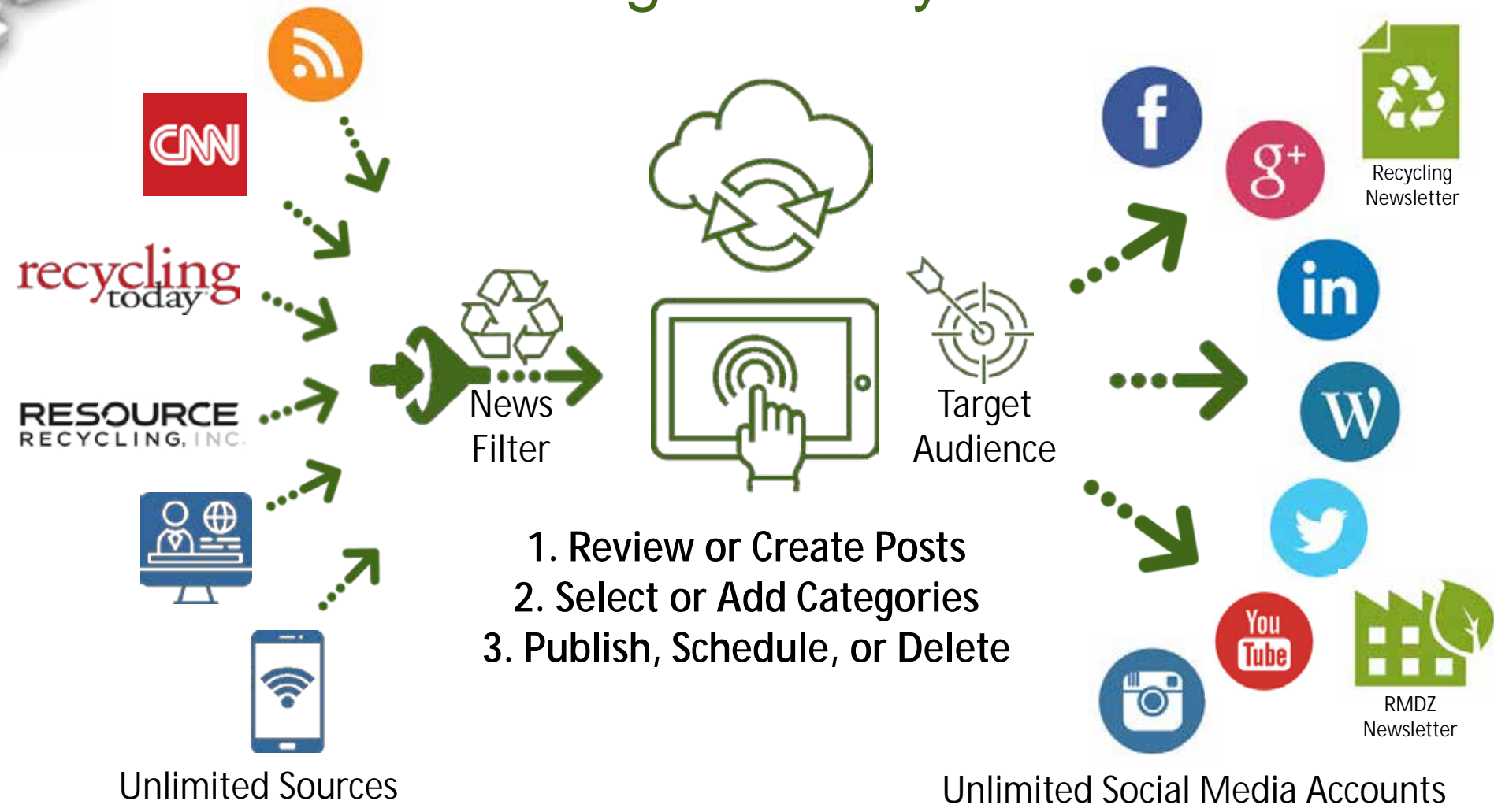

Market disruption prompts switch to dual-stream

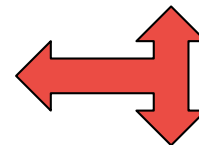
Debate over source separation has carried on since the single-stream concept emerged, but it has received particular attention over the past year, because of China's import restrictions and the ensuing market fallout.

Conferences around the country have featured discussions on the topic, and industry experts have been forced to defend single-stream, which has become the norm among municipal recycling programs nationwide.

But in New Jersey, a small municipality recently rolled back its single-stream program and reinstated source separation. Oakland, which has about 13,000 residents, had been utilizing a single-stream system for more than five years, but economics caused the borough to rethink that path this year.

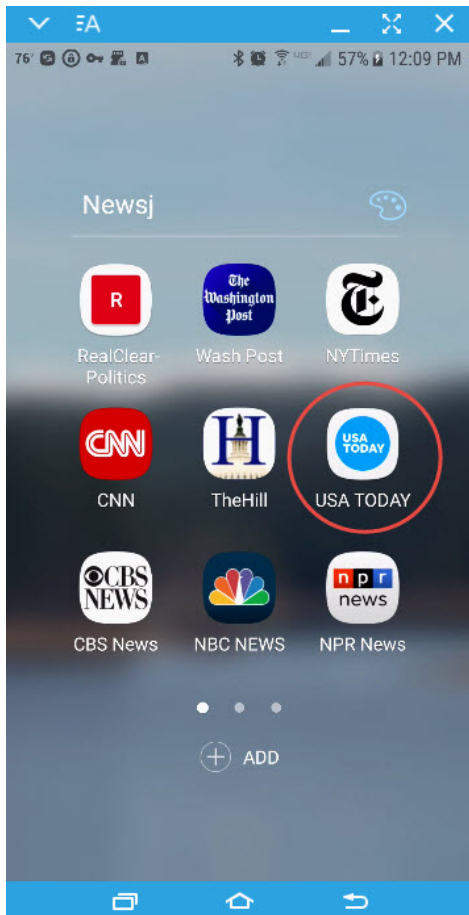

The RMDZ program provides low-interest loans to eligible businesses using secondary (post consumer or post industrial) waste materials to manufacture new products or reduce the waste resulting from manufacturing a product.

The program was developed by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) as part of an ongoing effort to increase the diversion of waste going to landfills. It is a partnership between CalRecycle and local jurisdictions.

This program provides business and technical assistance, product marketing, and financial assistance to businesses that manufacture a recycled-content product or process materials for recycling. Manufacturing or processing must occur within the RMDZ.

RMDZ INCENTIVES INCLUDE:

- **Low Interest Loans and Other Assistance with Financing** – The RMDZ can finance up to 75% of a project, up to \$2 million per loan. Loan terms are up to 15 years, and the low interest rates are from fixed-rate State funds. Rates are kept at or below the prime rate.
- **Permit Assistance** – public agencies will assist businesses through local and state permitting and regulatory processes.
- **Location Assistance** – businesses will be guided to over 12,000 acres of industrially zoned property, and other sites, throughout Ventura County.
- **Materials for Manufacturing** – Ventura County recycles over 200,000 tons of solid waste per year. Recyclables are collected through curbside, buyback, and drop-off programs and are processed in four main locations.
- **Other Benefits** – include business plan assistance, business incubator and industry cluster networks, promotion, capital network access, and financing assistance.
- **Who's Eligible** – Most program incentives are designed specifically for manufacturing businesses located in Ventura County. If a business manufactures a new product from recycled materials; processes recyclables in such a way that their market value is increased, repairs items that would otherwise become waste, or makes products using less materials or while generating less waste, it may be eligible for low-interest loans.

ADVANTAGES OF STARTING A BUSINESS IN VENTURA COUNTY

Beautiful Location: Ventura County's coast curves along 42 miles of mostly southwest facing beaches. Further inland, Ventura County's northern border runs alongside Kern County through the sparsely populated Los Padres National Forest. Focusing growth in urbanized areas, Ventura County still has significant amounts of agriculture and open space.

Quality of Life: The *Healthy Communities Institute* gave Ventura County a top score for public safety because it has one of the lowest crime rates in the state based on data from the state Department of Justice.

Land Available for Siting New Businesses: There are thousands of acres of industrially zoned land in Ventura County. Some of this designated land is undeveloped while other pieces have vacant buildings of varying sizes. Ventura County also has a well-developed infrastructure geared to handle planned growth.

Access to Markets: Ventura County, with a population over 800,000, borders the counties of Los Angeles, Santa Barbara, and Kern. Ventura County is served by uncrowded portions of highways 101, 126, 118, 23, and 1 as well as Southern Pacific rail lines and the Port of Hueneme, a deep water port with port of entry and foreign trade zone status.

Work Force: Ventura County has an educated, dependable labor supply and several programs enabling employers to obtain assistance through subsidized workers and employment training programs.

The RMDZ overlaps a foreign-trade zone, centered around the county's deepwater port. Ventura County has a dependable labor supply, uncrowded freeways, a thriving agricultural industry, and an infrastructure geared to handle planned growth. The county is adjacent to Los Angeles, providing access to large urban markets as well as sources of materials for manufacturing.

New Jobs, Expanded Market for Recycled Paper and Plastic--CalRecycle Approves \$1 Million Loan to Sustainable Packaging Company

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery has approved a \$1 million loan to expand a San Joaquin Valley company that makes bottles from recycled paper and plastic.

The Recycling Market Development Zone loan was awarded to Ecologic Brands of Manteca. It will help Ecologic utilize more California-generated cardboard, mixed paper, and plastic to make its paper bottles—diverting an estimated 458 tons of waste and creating 69 jobs in the process.

"California needs more projects like this to overcome current global market challenges—which can be greatly alleviated by building a more robust recycling infrastructure within our own state," CalRecycle Director Scott Smithline said. "CalRecycle's RMDZ loan program has a 25-year history of success supporting local businesses to keep valuable material out of landfills and boosting in-state markets for recyclable material."

Ecologic will use the \$1 million RMDZ loan to help fund the purchase and installation of new manufacturing equipment, which integrates paper/cardboard sheets with lightweight plastic bottles to form the finished product. The equipment upgrades are projected to do three things:

- Increase diversion of recycled paper by an additional 350 tons
- Increase diversion of recycled plastic by an additional 120 tons
- Create an additional 69 jobs

CalRecycle Support Available for Recycling Businesses

CalRecycle Backs Local Businesses to Increase Recycling: Local Economies Get a Green Boost from State-Local Partnership Program

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery has approved nearly \$4 million in new [Recycling Market Development Zone](#) loans for businesses to help increase carpet and paper recycling in the state. The local business investments in Los Angeles and Placer counties are expected to create at least 35 new jobs and divert an additional 17,000 tons of carpet and paper from California landfills each year.

"For the past 25 years, CalRecycle's RMDZ loan program has been an important tool to help California develop more recycling infrastructure in our state," CalRecycle Director Scott Smithline said. "Supporting these types of private infrastructure investments help insulate California from global market fluctuations—like we currently see as a result of China's National Sword policy—while making progress toward achieving the state's greenhouse gas reduction and 75 percent recycling goals."

Residuals are then sold to subsequent manufacturers. New diversion estimates: 14,719 tons per year (91 percent increase) New job estimates: 35

Both projects support the expansion of California's organic recycling infrastructure, which the state must roughly double to comply with the organic waste disposal reduction targets mandated by [SB 1383, Assembly Bill, Statutes of 2017](#).

New Jobs, Expanded Market for Recycled Paper and Plastic--CalRecycle Approves \$1 Million Loan to Sustainable Packaging Company

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery has approved a \$1 million loan to expand a San Joaquin Valley company that makes bottles from recycled paper and plastic.

The Recycling Market Development Zone loan was awarded to Ecologic Brands of Manteca. It will help Ecologic utilize more California-generated cardboard, mixed paper, and plastic to make its paper bottles—diverting an estimated 458 tons of waste and creating 69 jobs in the process.

"California needs more projects like this to overcome current global market challenges—which can be greatly alleviated by building a more robust recycling infrastructure within our own state," CalRecycle Director Scott Smithline said. "CalRecycle's RMDZ loan program has a 25-year history of success supporting local businesses to keep valuable material out of landfills and boosting in-state markets for recyclable material."

Ecologic will use the \$1 million RMDZ loan to help fund the purchase and installation of new manufacturing equipment, which integrates paper/cardboard sheets with lightweight plastic bottles to form the finished product. The equipment upgrades are projected to do three things:

- Increase diversion of recycled paper by an additional 350 tons
- Increase diversion of recycled plastic by an additional 120 tons
- Create an additional 69 jobs
