Program Overview

California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act

History:

- Established in 1986 through Assembly Bill 2020
- Calrecycle administers the program
- Aluminum, Glass, Plastic and Bimetal beverage Containers
- Reimbursement Program (\$.05 under 24oz & \$.10 on 24oz or greater)

Purpose:

- Achieve 80% recycling rate
- Provide convenient, efficient, and economical redemption opportunities, by collaborative the efforts of manufacturers, distributors, dealers, recycling centers, processors, and CalRecycle.

Who are the stakeholders?

How does the CRV and the beverage containers flow from stakeholder to stakeholder?

"Reimbursement Program"



Manufacturers:

Any entity that bottles, cans or fills beverage containers or imports filled containers for sale or distribution in CA



Distributors:

A distributor is any person/entity who engages in the sale of beverage containers to a dealer/retailer in CA



Retailers:

Sells beverage containers to consumers

Primary Program Stakeholders



Consumers:

Person who, for his or her own consumption, purchases a beverage in a beverage container from a dealer.



Recycling Centers (RC):

A business that pays consumers CRV for used beverage containers that are labeled with the CRV message



Processor:


Entity that is responsible for purchasing containers from certified entities (Recycling Centers) and canceling the material so that it may not be redeemed again


Primary Program Stakeholders



Submits CRV (5¢) for Beverage Containers sold in CA

















What is CRV?

- California Refund Value (CRV)
- Amount a consumer pays to the retailer on each beverage container purchased
- ➤ The minimum amount that recycling centers pay to consumers for redeeming empty beverage containers (EBCs)

Beverage containers sold in CA must be labeled with the CRV message

ALUMINUM OR BIMETAL CANS Example (A)

Section 2200(b)(1):

Metal containers shall be marked on the top end of the container in minimum lettering size at least 3/16" (inch) in height. Metal containers with a top lid of two inches or less in diameter shall have a minimum lettering size of at least 1/8" (inch) in height.

ALUMINUM OR BIMETAL BOTTLES

Section 2200(b)(4):

Metal bottles shall be marked on the side of the bottle in minimum lettering size at least 3/16" (inch) in height.

GLASS OR PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Option (1)

Section 2200(b)(2)(A):

Along the bottom edge of the container body label in minimum lettering size at least 3/16" (inch) in height.

Option (2)

Section 2200(b)(2)(B):

On or in a secondary label minimum lettering size at least 3/16" (inch) in height.

Option (3)

Section 2200(b)(2)(C):

On a container body label or secondary label with contrasting colors with legible lettering size at least 1/8" (inch) in height. Contrasting colors shall direct the readers to the message required.

PLASTIC PORTION CONTROLLED CUPS Section 2200 (b)(3):

Plastic portion controlled cups that have peelable, heat sealed lids that are not resealable, shall be marked in a minimum lettering size of at least 1/8" (inch) in height on either side of the container only, or on the lid and bottom of the container.

Example 🚯

CLEARLY AND PROMINENTLY Section 2000(a)(9) . . . means that the redemption message is displayed so that it is easily found and read by consumers and recyclers. Each letter comprising the message is complete, legible, and cannot be readily obscured. The message must be distinguishable from refund messages of other states.

CONTRASTING COLORS

Section 2000(a)(12). . . means a clear differentiation in hue, value, and intensity with the background on which the redemption message appears, surrounding artwork, and other nearby printed information.

INDELIBLY

Section 2000(a)(27). . .

means that the redemption message is permanently affixed on the beverage container from the point of purchase until the point of redemption and cannot be smeared or removed during regular use.

- Beer and malt beverages... for example: Budweiser, Coors, Corona, Heineken, Zima.
- Wine coolers and distilled spirit coolers... for example: Franzia Wine Coolers, Bartles & Jaymes Wine Coolers, Smirnoff Ice Spirit Coolers.
- Carbonated fruit drinks... for example: Martinelli's Sparkling Cider, Welch's Sparkling Grape.
- Noncarbonated fruit drinks that contain any percentage of fruit juice... for example: Hi-C, Margarita Mix, V8 Splash.
- Carbonated water, including soda and carbonated mineral water... for example: Crystal Geyser Sparkling Mineral Water, Arrowhead Sparkling Water (all flavors).
- Coffee and tea beverages... for example: Starbucks Frappuccino Coffee,
 Arizona Iced Tea (all flavors), Celestial Seasonings Tea (all flavors).

- Recycling centers must be certified to pay/receive CRV
- Attend Pre-certification training classes
- Pay current CRV Rate for beverage containers received
- Maintain appropriate record keeping and supporting documentation (ex. receipt & logs, daily summaries, shipping reports, weight tickets)
- Inspect each load of containers to determine if eligible for CRV

- Record Transactions; Receipts or Logs
- Recycling centers are required to prepare receipts for all transactions over \$100 in CRV
- Cannot pay or claim CRV for any material received from any person or entity not certified by the Division in excess of 100 pounds of aluminum or plastic and 1,000 pounds of glass
- Cannot purchase material from any person driving a motor vehicle with out-of-state plates in excess of \$50 in CRV

Purchase Logs

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Daily Summary

Recycling centers are required to summarize daily purchases for each material type. Must include:

- Total weight
- Total refund value

Note: Can be a computer spreadsheet or handwritten summary

Processor Responsibilities

Processor Responsibilities

- Receive and inspect UBC loads delivered by RCs for reimbursement
- Generate weight tickets
- Pay the RC based upon accurate/valid DR-6s
- Submit a reimbursement claim to the Division (DR-7)
- Cancel redeemed beverage container material


Processor Responsibilities

Material Cancellation

- Cancellation means the act of removing the refund value of an empty beverage container
- Cancellation requirements vary depending on the material type and where it is being shipped:
 - ✓ Densification
 - ✓ Shredding
 - ✓ Selling to an end user
 - ✓ Export outside CA




Distributors not paying CRV on Beverage Containers

Fraud in the Program

Falsification or Alteration of Purchase Records

- To increase volume and payments (Handling Fees, Processing Fees & Admin Fees)
- Falsify the purchase records to include the ineligible material.
 - Out of state, rejected containers or line breakage, cancelled material



Fraud in the Program

Claiming CRV on Rejected or Line Breakage containers

14CCR Section 2501(d):

... all rejected and line breakage containers are not eligible for any refund value payments.

Rejected containers/ Line Breakage:

- Defective containers that "never made it to the shelf"
- Distributor has not paid CRV into the Fund.
- Recycling centers should only pay scrap value on those containers, and the transaction should be recorded as scrap

Fraud in the Program

Cancelled Material/Previously baled



Previously baled containers:

Containers that have been baled by a baling machine (usually out-of-state or previously redeemed material).

14CCR Section 2501 (b):

A load of material shall be deemed <u>not</u> eligible for any refund value if any one of the following conditions exist:

- (1) There are pieces of broken, densified bales or biscuits of aluminum beverage containers within the load.
- (2) Pieces of bales of plastic are found in the load. This does not include cans which have merely been flattened









Fraud in the Program

Claiming CRV on Out of state Containers

- Beverage containers that have been purchased outside of CA
 - Common surrounding states- Arizona,
 Washington, Nevada,
 Country- Mexico
- At times have proper CRV labeling
- Ineligible for any CRV payment
 -no deposit made
- Recycling centers may not receive out of state material



Out of State Containers - Statute

Public Resources Code 14591(b)(1)

Every person who, with intent to defraud, takes any of the following actions is guilty of fraud:

- (D) Redeems out-of-state containers, rejected containers, line breakage, or containers that have already been redeemed.
- (F) Brings out-of-state containers, rejected containers, or line breakage to the marketplace for redemption.

Public Resources Code 14596(a)

Any person importing more than 25 pounds of aluminum, bimetal, or plastic beverage container material, or more than 250 pounds of glass beverage container, into the state, shall report the material to the department and provide the department with an opportunity for inspection, in accordance with the regulations adopted by the department.

Out of State Containers Regulations


California Code of Regulations, Section 2501(d)

All out-of-state material, whether labeled with the message required in Section 14561 of the Act or not, and all rejected and line breakage containers are not eligible for any refund value payments.

California Code of Regulations, Section 2501(f)

All loads containing out-of-state material received from consumers are not eligible for any refund value payments.

- Total material seized: aluminum 11,290lbs & PET 3,604lbs
- Total CRV if illegally redeemed \$22,388



Example 1

Recycler Committing Fraud

Estimated Yearly AL Vol. ~ 150,632 pounds
Estimated OOS AL Vol. for 12 months ~ 76,180
51% of the annual aluminum volume for this recycling center consisted of OOS material ~ Totaling \$ 95,173 in CRV and Admin. Fees

Example 2

Organized Groups and Recycling Center Committing Fraud

Total Estimated damage to the Fund by a certified recycling center working with an organized group for a 12 month period = \$681,578



Out of State Importers Unloading Large Bags of Aluminum Out of State Used Beverage Containers, and selling to a Certified Recycling Center for California Redemption Value (CRV).

Estimated damage to the Fund \$ 465,658 /year Average of 2 loads per month







Damage to the Fund: 4492.24 (AL) + 833.23 (PET) = \$ 5325.47 Damage to the Fund: \$7,076.88

What equals a pound of Aluminum?

Equals approx. 30 cans 100 lbs. equals 3,000 cans


everyone would have to consume 5 cans a day for 6 month to accumulate 100 lbs.

RPEB Responsibilities

- Field inspections
- Investigations/audits, prepayment reviews, risk assessment, data analysis
- Probationary reviews
- Forensic document analysis
- Authorizations to cancel
- Accusation development
- DOJ criminal case referrals
- <u>Potential Outcomes:</u> Extend Probation, Revoke or suspend Certification, NOV, NONC, Restitution, Civil penalties.
- Interagency Agreements: Department of Justice (Recycling Fraud) & Department of Food & Agriculture (Border Stations)
- Office Locations: Sacramento, Riverside, Los Angeles, San Diego (Approx. 58 Staff members)

Fraud Preventive Tools


- Claims Volume Report (CVR)
- Consumer Transaction Profiles (CTP)
- Recycler Inspection Program (RIP)
- Prepayment Inspection Status (PIS)
- Recycler Inspections Test Sales
- Imported Material Report Database (IMR)



Claims Volume Report (CVR)

Detects unusually high volume and/or anomalous characteristics in program participant reporting/payment data

Protect the Fund by detecting, preventing and/or mitigating the Fund impacts associated with unsupported or potentially fraudulent claims for reimbursement of CRV



Consumer Transaction Profile (CTP)


- Conduct random visits at recycling centers
- Observe and document consumer transactions for 3-5 days
 - Determine average daily volume





Recycler Inspection Program (RIP)

- Inspect loads delivered by RCs at Processor facilities
 - Conduct random visits at Processor facilities
- Reduce or deny shipping report claims to accurately reflect load



Prepayment Inspection Status (PIS):

- RC will not receive CRV payment until authorized by department staff
 - RC must notify CalRecycle at least 48 hours prior to load delivery
 - RC must submit shipping reports, original consumer purchase receipts, logs and daily summaries for review
 - Calrecycle staff has opportunity to inspect loads at Processor



IMR Regulations - highlights

- Requires importer (of >25 lbs.) to fully cooperate with CDFA inspector, Division staff, law enforcement officer or other appropriate official to fulfill the purposes of PRC 14596 including, but not limited to:
 - Declaring the material at the inspection station
 - Providing and Imported Material Report (IMR) with the appropriate sections completed and the proper supporting documents attached
 - Offering the material for inspection, following directions for completing the inspection, and obtaining a proof of inspection (POI)
 - Providing full, true and correct information

Partners in our fight against CRV fraud

- California Department of Justice
- California Attorney General's Office
- California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA)

LEAs/CalRecycle Collaboration

Notify the Investigations Section if you see suspicious activities such as:

- Individuals with large loads at recycling centers
- Individuals delivering material from trucks/vehicles parked outside the recycling center
- Uncertified mobile recyclers buying materials on the streets
- Individuals storing materials at public storage facilities,
 warehouses and residences

Obtain:

- Location information
- Vehicle information license plate number, make and model
- Photos of the material, individuals, locations and vehicles
